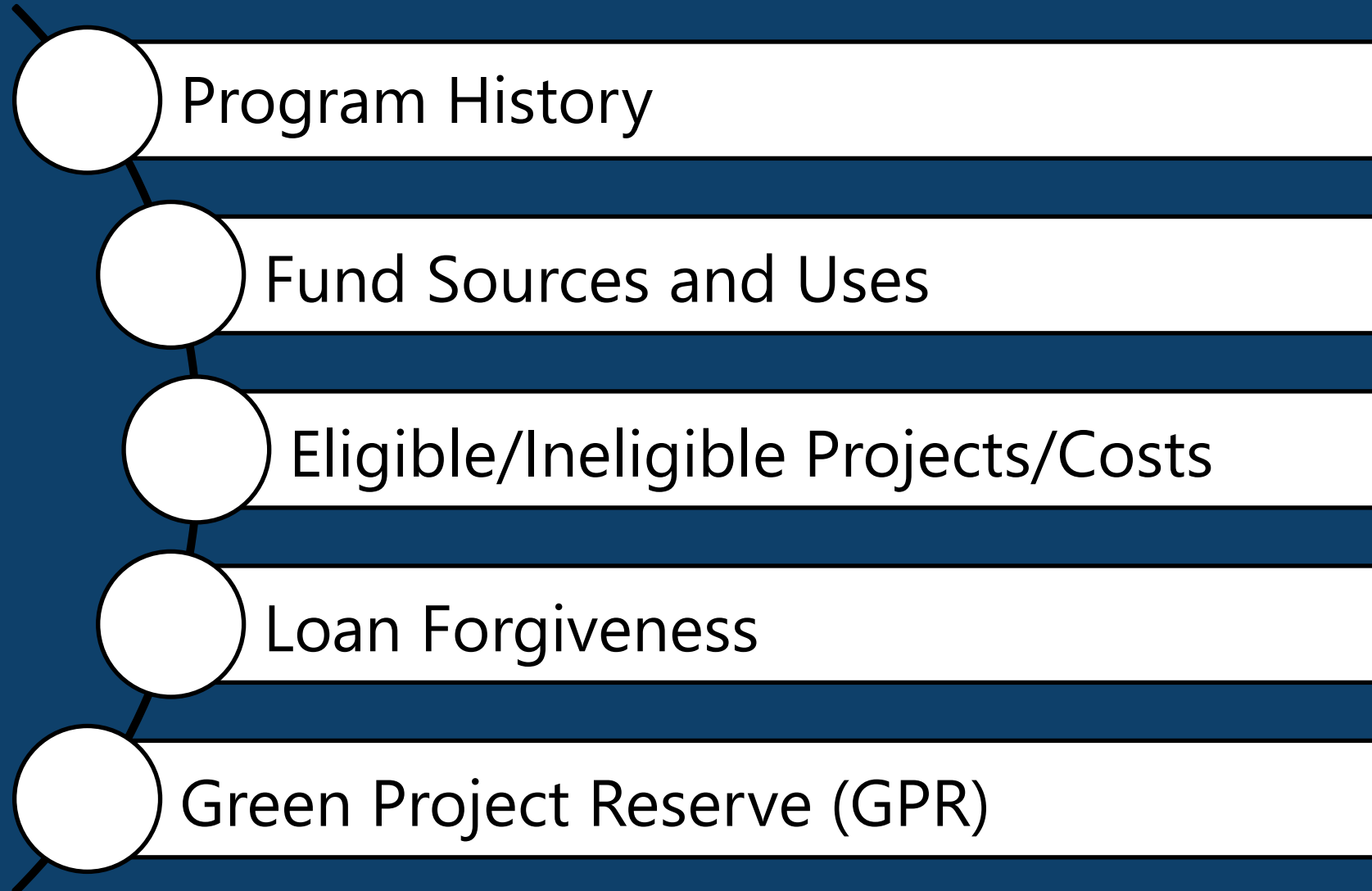

SRF Program History

- Started in 1987 through the Clean Water Act
- Authorized under the 1996 amendments to the Safe Drinking Water Act (SDWA)
- Loan (2.0% total rate effective as of 1/1/2017)
 - 1.5% interest rate
 - 0.5% administrative fee
 - Maximum of 30 years or useful life of project, whichever is shorter

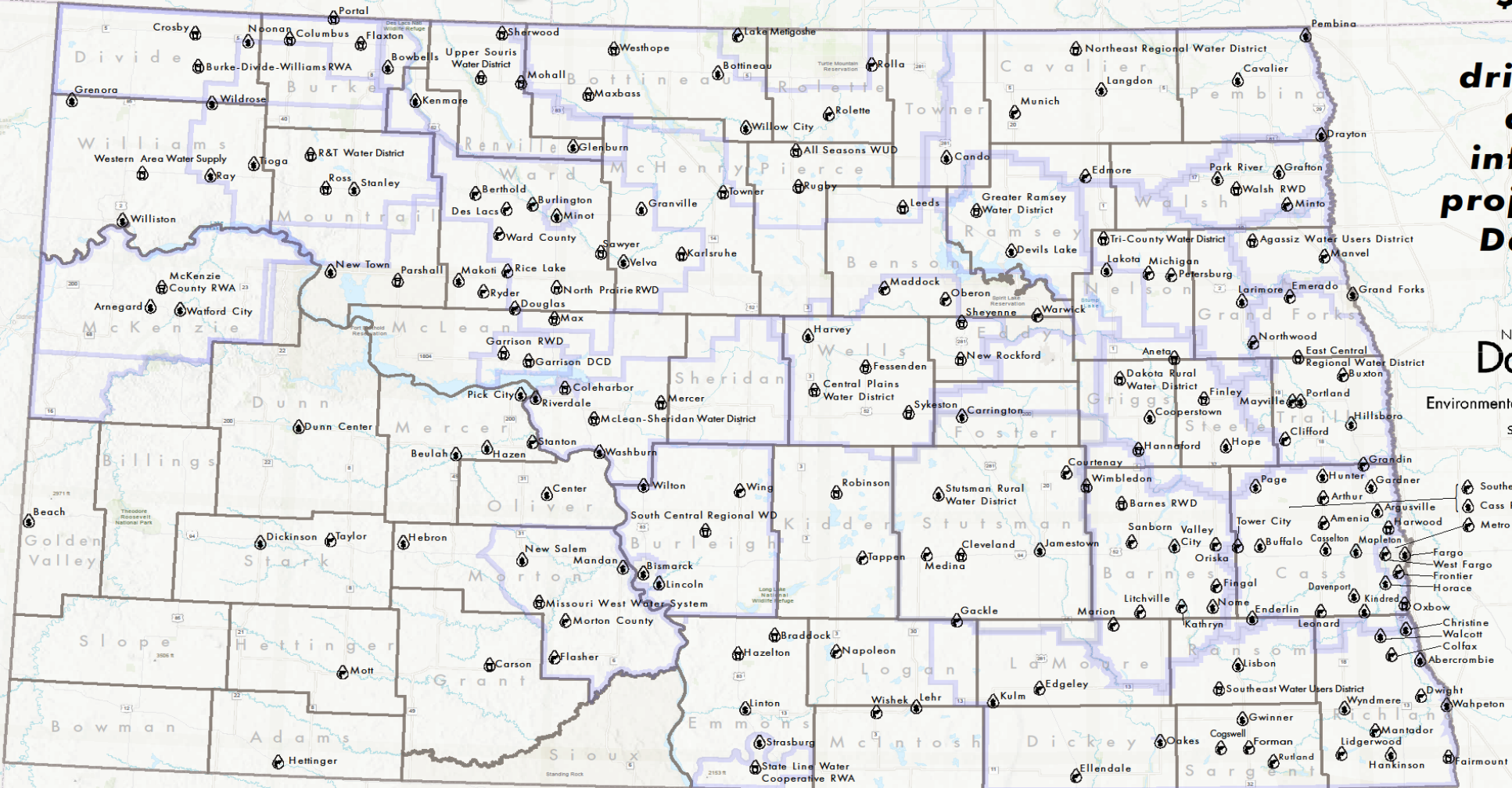





These communities, counties, water user districts, regions or associations have received both Clean Water SRF and Drinking Water SRF loans.

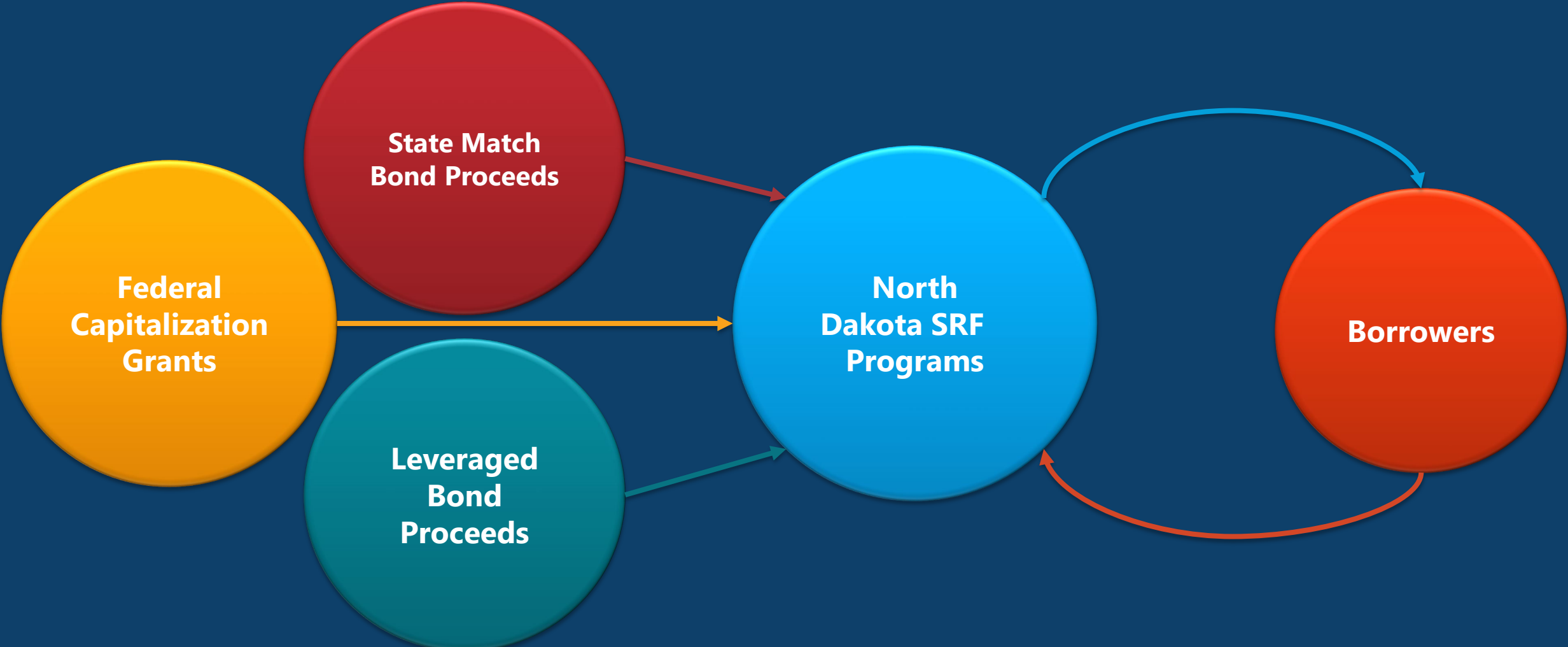


-  County Boundary

- Capitalization Grants from EPA
- State match bond proceeds

About the SRF Process

- State SRF programs develop priority ranking systems for use of their capitalization grant which must be approved by EPA
 - Intended Use Plan (IUP) formalized at the beginning of each year
 - May be amended throughout the year if necessary
- State SRF programs are required to provide some of the capitalization grant as “additional subsidy”
 - In North Dakota, we refer to it as “loan forgiveness”

CWSRF Eligible Projects

- Centralized Wastewater Treatment (treatment works)
 - Primary/secondary
 - Advanced
 - Sewer Systems
 - Combined sewer overflow (CSO) correction
- Renewable energy projects for POTWs (project specific)
- Water conservation projects
 - Water meters (non-treatment works)
 - Water efficient irrigation equipment (non-treatment works)
 - Water reuse (project specific)
- Stormwater (non-treatment works)
- Landfills(non-treatment works)
 - liners and leachate collection systems for cells, monitoring wells, capping systems

DWSRF Eligible Projects

- Source water: surface water intake structures, groundwater wells
- Water treatment plants
- Drinking water storage
- Distribution (mains, booster stations, service lines, water meters)

DWSRF Non-Eligible Projects

- Projects primarily for future growth
- Projects primarily intended to provide fire protection

Other Eligible Projects

- Interconnection of systems/regionalization
- Security measures to protect infrastructure from vandalism
- Measures to ensure continued operation in the event of an emergency (generators, flood protection devices)
- Administration buildings for the water or wastewater system
- Lead service line replacement-entire service line needs to be replaced

Street Repair Eligibility



- Street repairs needed due to drinking water, sanitary sewer, and storm sewer utilities are eligible for the SRF programs
- Street repairs that are deemed ineligible for the SRF can be funded through the BND Infrastructure Revolving Loan Fund (IRLF)
- The SRF programs and the BND IRLF will use the same loan application – no need to submit separate loan applications
- The loans will be kept separate

Federal Requirements

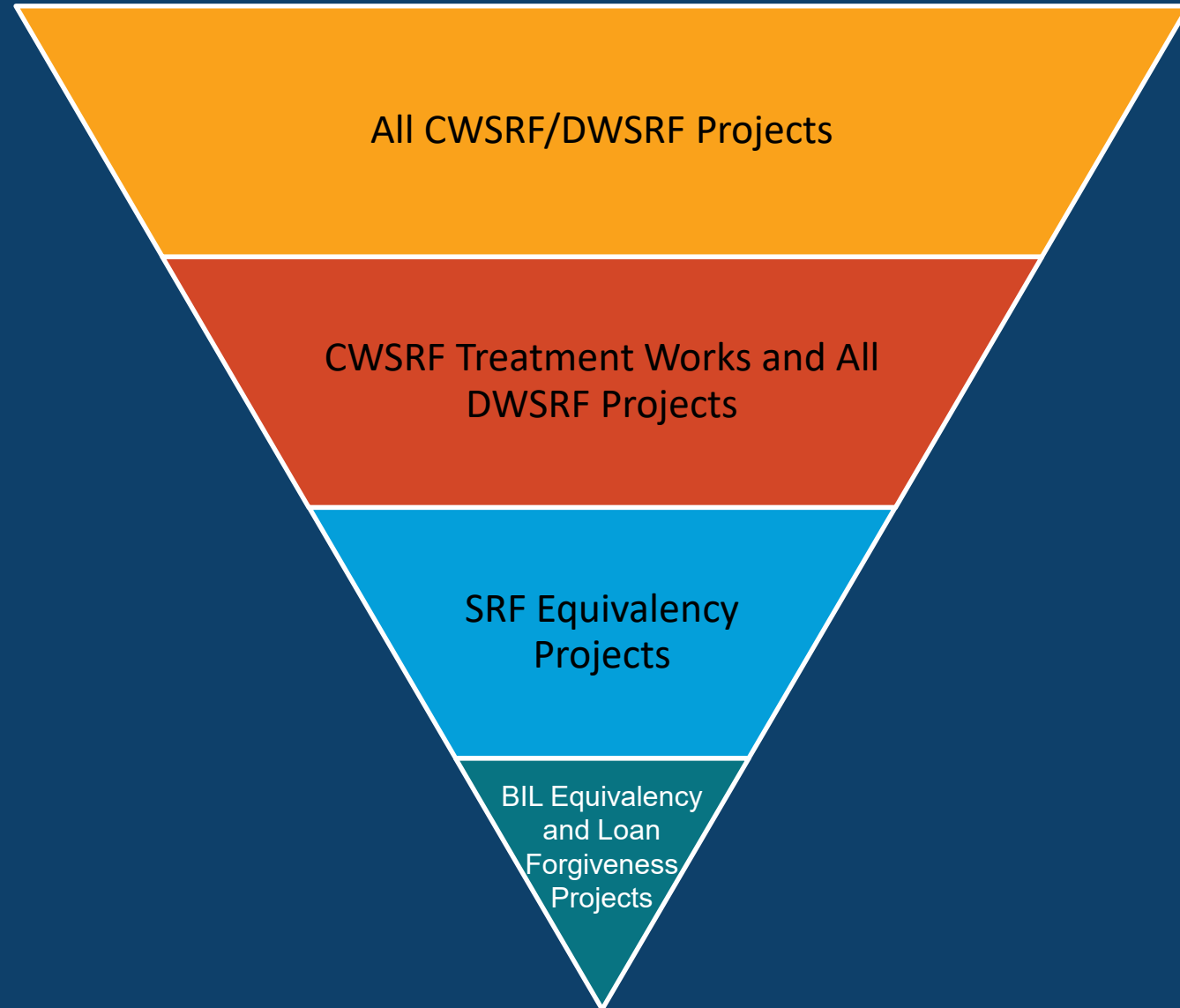
- Because the SRF programs receive federal funds, there are some federal requirements that must be followed
- Federal requirements depend on the type of project and whether or not the project is an “equivalency project”
 - All CWSRF/DWSRF Projects
 - CWSRF Treatment Works and all DWSRF Projects
 - SRF Equivalency Projects
 - BIL Equivalency and/or BIL Loan Forgiveness Projects

Equivalency Projects

- Some federal requirements apply:
 - “in an amount made directly available by” the federal capitalization grant
- What that means:
 - State can choose a project (or group of projects)
 - Project(s) must equal (or exceed) the cap grant’s value
 - Only equivalency project(s) must meet certain federal requirement
- **May be eligible for an interest rate reduction**

Architectural/Engineering Procurement

Federal Procurement Requirements must be followed for engineering with CWSRF equivalency loans:

1. Request for Qualifications
2. Evaluation based on established, publicly available criteria which does NOT include cost
3. Discussion with at least 3 firms to consider concepts & alternatives
4. Selection of at least 3 firms to be the most highly qualified
5. Contract negotiation with the most highly qualified to determine compensation, scope, complexity and estimate value of the services

About the BIL

Expands domestic preference requirements (Build America Buy America) for equivalency projects

Adds signage requirements for BIL equivalency and/or BIL loan forgiveness projects

BABA

- “Build America, Buy America Act”
- All materials (including iron, steel, non-ferrous metals, plastic- and polymer-based products, lumber, and drywall) must be produced in the United States
- Sand, gravel, aggregates, and aggregate binding agents do not have to meet BABA
- Applies to all federal funds for infrastructure projects and will be administered by the Office of Management and Budget
- Went into effect on May 14, 2022
- Possible project delays and/or increased costs due to availability of materials???

BABA Adjustment Period Waiver

If a project can provide evidence for any of the following conditions prior to May 14, 2022, it would qualify:

1. Submitted partial or completed plans and specifications by the borrower to the SRF.
2. Submitted preliminary engineering report, or equivalent, by an engineering firm to the borrower or by the borrower to the SRF.
3. Initiated design planning by the in-house staff of the borrower.
4. Approved or executed an SRF loan for design and/or engineering, which may or may not include construction.
5. Solicited bids or executed a contract for design and/or engineering, including contracts not funded by an SRF.
6. Solicited bids or executed a contract for construction.
7. Initiated the process of securing other financing, such as issuing bonds.
8. Scheduled or held a public referendum on the project or scheduled or held a public meeting about the project.

EPA amended this waiver on November 13, 2023 to restrict its use to the 2022 and 2023 equivalency projects

BABA De Minimis Waiver

BABA requirements can be waived for products used in and incorporated into a project that cumulatively comprise no more than 5 percent of the total project cost

Project components to which the waiver applies will need to be tracked

BABA Small Project Waiver

Applies to

BABA

- Waivers can be requested if:
 - BABA would be inconsistent with the public interest (“public interest waiver”)
 - Materials are not produced in the United States in sufficient and reasonably available quantities of a satisfactory quality (“nonavailability waiver”)
 - Inclusion of materials produced in the United States will increase the cost of the overall project by more than 25 percent (“unreasonable cost waiver”)

BABA

Project-specific waiver process may be lengthy:

- Borrower (with the assistance of SRF program staff) prepare a waiver request
- EPA conducts market research to determine merits of the waiver request
- EPA posts the waiver request for a 15-day public comment period
- Borrower (with the assistance of SRF program staff) respond to public comments
- EPA staff make a recommendation to EPA headquarters
- EPA headquarters approves the waiver
- OMB reviews and approves the waiver

Contact the SRF program to find out if BABA will apply and, if it does, if a waiver can be obtained

Full Lead Service Line Replacement

Any lead service line replacements must replace the **entire** lead service line, not just a portion, unless a portion has already been replaced or is concurrently being replacement with another funding source.

SRF Tracker will not allow access until AFTER you have:

- Log into the NDLogin app to confirm account exists or to unlock your existing account: NDLogin Link
- If a successful login, set the cell phone number and if setting up a new account, request a verification text to activate the account (The security phone number is not required when setting up an ND Login account, but if not populated you can't log in to SRF Tracker).
- Once completed, email the NDLogin Id to ndsrf@nd.gov to have an SRF Tracker account created. NOTE: send only the NDLogin ID do NOT include the password.

If you already have a North Dakota login that works with other ND apps, you do not need to create a new account!
If you do not have an existing NDLogin you MUST set one up prior to sending an email to request access to SRF Tracker. SRF Tracker uses a NDLogin authenticator and your account will be locked if you try to request SRF Tracker access before you have an approved NDLogin!

Do NOT use the dash (-) or ampersand (&) in your ND Login password, you will not be able to log into SRF Tracker.

SRF Requests for Payment

First request must be at least 5% of loan amount or \$50,000 whichever is less and must be submitted within one year of the loan approval date

Except for the final, all requests must be a minimum of \$2,500

Payment requests must be submitted in SRF Tracker by the authorized representative named in the Resolution of Governing Body of Applicant found in the loan application.

Pay requests should be submitted at least quarterly, and possibly monthly for larger loan amounts

General Requirements

Copy of engineering agreement(s) required before any engineering fees are reimbursed – must be uploaded in SRF Tracker

PLANNING ASSISTANCE REIMBURSEMENT (PAR) GRANTS

PAR Grants

Political Subdivision with a population of 2,500 or less

Covers up to 80% of the report cost or a maximum \$15,000

Comprehensive Study of Water or Wastewater System

Must be eligible to borrow from the SRF programs
